We were honoured to recently receive donations from two Freemason Lodges for EPC's Equipment for Home Appeal. Two members of the Lodge of Quest in Ringwood, Steve and Wayne, attended our offices to meet with

Gaylene, our CEO.

They learnt about our services and the Equipment for Home Appeal which will help us to assist clients with medical equipment for their home, so they can remain being cared for in familiar surroundings.

Steve and Wayne then presented a cheque to Gaylene to the value of \$6,500. This was made up of funds from the Ringwood Lodge and the Freemasons Foundation. This donation will contribute to the Appeal and will also be used to purchase a specialised hospital bed for very tall people that can be lowered to the floor.

We thank the Lodge Blackburn branch who also facilitated a large donation of \$5,500, again with a contribution from the Freemasons Foundation. This will allow EPC to purchase a 'Sara Stedy - Sit to stand aid' and two Bath lifts so clients can use their bath at home. We look forward to a continuing relationship with the Lodges of Quest Ringwood and Blackburn, plus the Freemasons Foundation, and we thank them for their generosity.

Our Noala Flynn AM Award Nominees

Two of our wonderful nurses, Bron Lee and Nicky Ronayne, were nominated for the prestigious Noala Flynn AM Award for Excellence in Palliative Care Nursing.

This esteemed award recognises the outstanding achievements of specialist palliative care nurses and pays tribute to the memory of Noala Flynn AM, a pioneering palliative care nurse and leader in Victoria.

The Noala Flynn AM Award for Excellence in Palliative Care Nursing recognises the profound impact that palliative care nurses have on the lives of patients and their families during times of vulnerabilityand need. It highlights the invaluable role they play in providing comfort, dignity, and support throughout the end-of-life journey.



Meet Bron Lee and Nicky Ronayne



Bron Lee started working in palliative care in 1989. She cared for patients at the Caritas Christie Hospice in Kew before moving into community palliative care nursing at the Yarra Valley Community Health Service. Bron has worked in community palliative care for the last 13 years.

Bron commenced with EPC in 2010 and has been instrumental in building EPC's intake team, providing excellent clinical expertise, care and support to our potential clients. Bron has also assisted carers and other health professionals in navigating the health system to ensure the right person is receiving the right care at the right time.

Bron has an extensive understanding of the palliative care landscape, with her work at the Palliative Care Advice Service providing a high-level understanding of EPC's place within the Victorian healthcare system. This has made Bron a valued member of EPC's Clinical Council.

Bron is energetic and passionate, yet calm under stress. She is able to manage crises with professionalism and a keen focus on reducing risk. Bron has mentored a variety of staff and is always willing to question how care is provided to ensure we are always striving for the highest standard of evidence-based care. She frequently goes above and beyond not only for clients and carers, but to support her team.

Bron is a huge asset to the intake team, to EPC and to the greater palliative care community. She is well deserving of her nomination for the Nola Flynn AM Award.

Nicky Ronayne began her nursing career in Middlesex Hospital London. After leaving London she worked at an inpatient hospice. It was here that Nicky was mentored by some amazing, experienced palliative care nurses and knew this was the area of work she wanted to continue.


Eventually Nicky joined the community palliative care team of nurses (Macmillan Nurses) attached to the hospice. It was here she found her niche and felt the area of palliative care nursing to be the most rewarding.

Nicky migrated to Australia in 1991 and was out for a bit of adventure. She was offered a job at Caritas Christi Kew as their first CNS and started work there 7 days after arriving in the country!

In 1993, Nicky joined a small multidisciplinary team to establish the first community palliative care team, based at Caritas Christ, a joint initiative of The Order of Malta and Caritas Christi. On day one they had just one client and so Nicky and another nurse set about visiting GP's to tell them about our service. The rest is history and this team is now EPC inner team, still based at Caritas Christi but in rather nicer offices!

Nicky continues to be an integral part of the EPC Outer team, clients and carers often speak of the support and education she provides in assisting them in navigating such a challenging time. Nicky is a valued team member who readily extends her knowledge and expertise in mentoring of new staff, clinical leadership and teaching and we congratulate her on this nomination.
